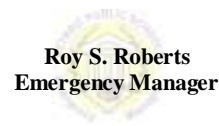

Compact Eligible Students

- ❖ All middle School students attending a compact school are eligible to join the Compact program.
- ❖ All incoming 9th graders who enroll at non-examination DPS compact high schools.
- ❖ Incoming 9th graders who attended one of the Compact middle schools and enroll at one of the following Detroit examination high schools: (Cass Technical, Renaissance, & Martin Luther King, Jr.)

Mission

The Detroit Compact is an education, community, parent, student, government, labor and business partnership designed to increase the number of Detroit Public School students who are college ready.

Program Benefits

To help motivate students to achieve academic excellence, college tuition assistance will be provided as an incentive for students to meet the Compact four-year or two-year standards.

Additionally, Detroit Compact offers many of the following program components for the success of our students:

- ACT/SAT Preparation programs
- College and Career Exploration
- Recognition Activities
- Workshops and Seminars
- Community Service Projects



Standards Matter...

The following standards were established to determine the on-target status for all Compact students:

Four Year College Standards

- ❖ 95% Attendance or better
- ❖ 3.0+ cumulative GPA (9th – 12th grade)
- ❖ 21 or better ACT score
- ❖ SAT results (990 or better) in reading and math **only**
- ❖ No major discipline violations as defined by the high school student code of conduct.
- ❖ Meet requirements for college.
- ❖ Maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 while enrolled at the sponsoring college/university.
- ❖ Maintain continuous, full-time enrollment at the sponsoring university (12 or more credits per semester) until graduation but not later than 4 years.



Community College Standards

- ❖ 95% Attendance or better
- ❖ 2.0+ cumulative GPA
- ❖ 18 or better ACT score
- ❖ SAT results (900-989) in reading and math **only**
- ❖ No major discipline violations as defined by the high school student code of conduct

Compact Scholars must...

- ❖ *Apply for financial assistance regardless of need as required by the sponsoring university thru www.fafsa.ed.gov*
- ❖ *Submit all support documentation as required by the Detroit Compact program prior to May 1 of the year you graduate from high school to your compact coordinator.*
