1.0 Policy

The General Superintendent of schools is assigned full responsibility for administration of the school system. All employees of the Board of Education will report to the Board through the General Superintendent.

The General Superintendent will be responsible for recommending to the Board the administrative structure of the school system. The structure will establish clear lines of responsibility and open channels of communication. The organizational plan will be reviewed regularly so that it may be kept up to date with the needs of the district.

Administrative Areas

For purposes of school administration, the Board approves the establishment of Regional Superintendents for elementary and middle schools and a nongeographic administrative area G to include all high schools.

The geographic areas will be structured to be as equal as possible in the number of schools and student population, and will bear no relationship to the school system's voting districts.

Each administrative area, including the one established for high schools, will be headed by General Superintendent, to whom principals of the schools will report through the regional superintendent.

Note: The administrative organization, fully effective July 1, 1983, is set forth in the document "Reorganization and Beyond-The Detroit Public School Plan," dated 12/16/82 and subsequent tables of organization adopted 2/8/83. The reorganization was approved in principle 7/27/82.
