VISIT A SCHOOL.

Once you have gathered the necessary paperwork, call the school to arrange a visit. A parent or guardian should accompany students. Except for application schools, students are assigned to schools in their neighborhood. Parents whose children are new or returning to the district should visit their school of choice to enroll.

Enrollment into an examination school or application school, as well as enrolling special needs students, requires further steps beyond those listed above. IMMUNIZATIONS

Parents or guardians are urged to take their children to a health care provider to get their immunizations up to date. These will be required for enrollment. For immunization information, parents may contact:

- Their health care provider
- The local health department: **313-876-4334**
- The DPS Department of Health and Physical Education: **313-873-7735**

For free- or low-cost health coverage for children under age 19, call the Michigan Child and Healthy Kids hotline: **313-961-2229**.

Free immunizations will be available from noon to 4 p.m. during the DPS Education and Enrollment Expo on Saturday, August 27, at Hart Plaza.

ON TRACK FOR GRADUATION

DPS high school students are required to meet Michigan's higher graduation standards. For those who have fallen behind, there are many opportunities to recover credits. Check into your school's Extended Day and Summer School programs.

English Language Arts: 4 credits

English Language Arts 9-12

Mathematics: 4 credits

Geometry, Algebra I, Algebra II and one math or math-related course in final year of high school

Science: 3 credits

Biology, Chemistry or Physics, and one additional science credit

Social Studies: 3 credits

World History & Geography, U.S. History & Geography, .5 credit in both Civics and Economics

Physical Education & Health: 1 credit

Visual, Performing and Applied Arts: 1 credit

FREE/REDUCED MEAL PROGRAM

The DPS Office of Food Services serves healthy meals to students up to three times per day. Our free breakfast in the classroom program makes getting your child to school easier than ever. Hot lunches are also served throughout the district.

DPS offers Free and Reduced Meals to qualifying students. Students qualify based upon guidelines set by the Federal government. Applications may be picked up at your child's school. After completing the application, return it to the school for processing. If your child qualifies, a notification letter will be sent to the student's school within 10 business days.

The Office of Food Services utilizes the Family Application, in which one application is used for all students who reside in the same household. An exception applies to foster children, who require separate applications.

DPS students are able to receive free or reduced meals if they meet basic guidelines:

- Family income is at or below 130 percent of the poverty level
- A child whose family income is between 130 and 185 percent of the poverty level can receive reduced-cost meals (students in this category charged 40 cents per meal)
- After-school snacks and supper are provided for children using the same income guidelines; however, students attending a school where at least 50 percent of students are eligible for Meal Benefits are all provided snacks and supper free of charge. This applies to most DPS schools.

PRE-K

Detroit Public Schools offers free, full-day pre-kindergarten programs. We have certified teachers who use a High Scope Curriculum. We offer free breakfast, lunch and a snack, and provide services for children with special needs. Parent involvement is strongly encouraged and supported. Children must be 4 years old by December 1. Parents and guardians must apply in person and provide the following:

- Child's birth certificate
- Proof of income (W-2, pay stub, public assistance documents, etc.)
- A completed Child Application Form, which is available at every DPS pre-K

TRANSPORTATION

DPS provides school bus transportation to all students in grades K-8 who live three-quarters of one mile or more from their neighborhood school. Some high school students can qualify for free and reduced D-DOT bus cards, which are distributed two weeks after the start of school. To qualify, students must attend their neighborhood school, receive meal benefits and live more than 1.5 miles from school. Transportation for Special Education students is assigned based on each student's IEP.

SPORTS. PROUD STRONG LEARNERS.

The Detroit Public School League (PSL) is fertile territory for athletic talent. Because of the high caliber of competition, college coaches flock to our sporting events to find recruits. The PSL offers a full range of competition in baseball, track and field, cross country, tennis, golf, swimming and soccer for boys; and softball, volleyball, track and field, cross country, tennis, swimming, golf and soccer for girls.

If your child plans to compete in the Detroit PSL, make sure they complete a physical exam for sports, which you can get from your health care provider. Students must also maintain at least a 2.0 GPA in his/her core subjects: Math, English, Science and Social Studies.

PARENT RESOURCE CENTERS

The DPS Parent Resource Centers are comfortable community gathering spaces equipped with computers as well as phones, sofas, small libraries, play areas for children and more. They offer expert-led workshops, child care, job training, MEAP assistance, college information, coffee talks and other opportunities. Stop in to learn more about DPS schools, use the computers to tap into Learning Village or take advantage of one of the educational workshops.
