



# AABE National Scholarship

The American Association of Blacks in Energy awards graduating seniors different scholarship opportunities for students interested in pursuing a degree and career in energy related fields.

## Who is eligible?

Any current high school **senior** who:

- Has an overall “B” academic average and a “B” average in mathematics and science courses (3.0 or better on a 4.0 scale).
- Plans to major in business, engineering, technology, mathematics or physical science fields.
- Demonstrates financial need.
- Is a member of one of the underrepresented minority groups (African American, Hispanic or Native American) in the sciences and related areas of technology.

## How much is the scholarship?

- Regional Award of \$3,000
- Premier Award of \$5,000

## What information is needed to apply?

- Completed AABE application form (copies are acceptable)
- A high school transcript
- Official proof of ACT or SAT scores
- Two letters of reference

# FEEA Fund Scholarship

The FEEA Fund Scholarship awards up to \$5,000.00 in scholarships to federal employees, their spouses, and children.

## Who is eligible?

Any current high school senior who:

- Current civilian federal and postal employees with at least three years of federal service, their children and spouses
- Plans to enroll in an accredited post-secondary school
- Course of study that leads to a two-year, four-year or graduate degree
- 3.0 grade point average on a 4.0 scale

## How much is the scholarship?

- \$250.00- \$5,000

## What is required to apply?

- Complete high school or college transcripts
- One written recommendation/letter of reference
- A short essay
- A list of community service, extracurricular activities and awards
- A copy of the employee sponsor's most recent SF-50

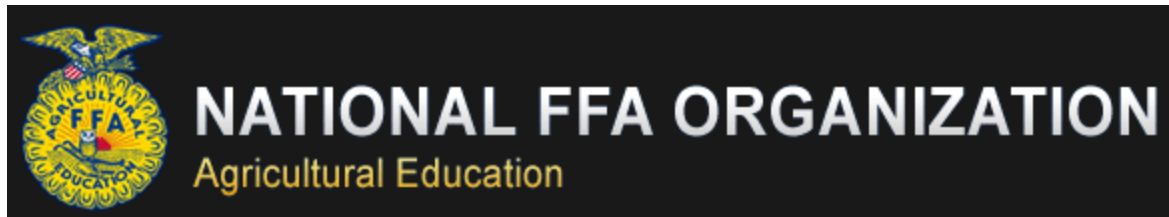

- Is less than 23 years of age at time of application. (February 15, 2012)
- Is a current FFA members unless otherwise stated
- Has a valid mailing address in the U.S.
- Plans to attend post-secondary school in the U.S.
- Is a full-time student if enrolled in a post-secondary institution (minimum 12 credit hours)

### **How may scholarships be used?**

- The scholarships are solely for educational expenses. That includes books, supplies, tuition, fees, and room and board unless otherwise indicated.

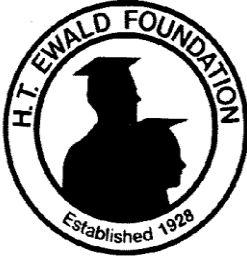

# Michigan Society of Professional Engineers



The Michigan Society of Professional Engineers offers scholarships in an effort to promote the ethical, competent practice of engineering, advocate licensure, and enhance the image and well-being of engineers.

## Eligibility and Requirements:

- Be accepted at a Michigan ABET accredited college or university and enroll in an engineering program. Scholarship awards are contingent upon acceptance for admission and an intent to earn a degree in engineering and enter the practice of engineering after graduation
- Be a high school senior, a resident of Michigan, and a U.S. Citizen at the time of application.
- Have at least a 3.0 grade point average (based on a 4.0 scale) for the 10th and 11th grades.
- Attain a minimum composite test score of 26 on the American College Testing (ACT) Exam.
- Submit a list of senior classes being taken.
- Attach a documented high school transcript and ACT test score to be considered.
- Submit only the current year MSPE application. Additional forms are available from MSPE

- SAT or ACT scores sent to the Foundation directly from the testing agencies. The Foundation's college codes are: SAT 4248/ACT: 6570.
