DIA IS UNIQUE BECAUSE IT

- ◆ **Provides an alternative** to traditional co-ed education in a secure, clean, and nurturing environment.
- ◆ **Reinforces** a “can do” philosophy.
- ◆ **Ensures** that learning takes center stage, with time outside the classroom for social life.
- ◆ **Teaches** collaborative as well as competitive skills.
- ◆ **Guarantees** that math, science, and technology are integral parts of the Curriculum.

SELECTION PROCESS

All students will be selected based upon the availability of space and the following:

- ◆ The completion of an application for each child by parent or guardian
- ◆ Verification of student’s grade level as determined by student’s last official report card (Non DPS or DPS)
- ◆ The student’s ability to maintain good citizenship, attendance, and passing grades.
- ◆ Student’s and parent’s willingness to accept the district and DIA guidelines for appropriate behavior
- ◆ Parent’s and student’s signatures of agreement to wear DIA uniforms everyday to attend class
- ◆ Parent’s willingness to actively support in-school activities and events.
- ◆ If a student has a sibling attending DIA, she may be given special placement consideration in the enrollment process.

DIA UNIFORM

(K-5) School Uniform

FORMAL UNIFORM - Must be worn every Wednesday, for field trips, and for special events.

- ◆ White blouse with round or peter pan collar (long or short sleeve)
- ◆ Gray Plaid Jumper
- ◆ White knee socks or white opaque tights (spring/summer)
- ◆ Black knee socks or black opaque tights (fall/winter)
- ◆ Solid black casual shoes (enclosed toe)

INFORMAL UNIFORM

- ◆ White polo shirt with school logo (White straight collar, round collar, or turtle neck shirts are acceptable styles.)
- ◆ Black cardigan sweater with school logo
- ◆ Black sweater vest with school logo
- ◆ Solid black jumper
- ◆ Solid black skorts
- ◆ Solid black slacks (No Jeans)
- ◆ Solid black shoes
- ◆ Light pink sweatshirt with school logo - optional (to be worn on informal days only)
